**Phyllis Bennis** is director of the New Internationalism Project at the Institute for Policy Studies. She has been a writer, analyst, and activist on Middle East and UN issues for many years. In 2001 she helped found and remains on the steering committee of the U.S. Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation. She works closely with the United for Peace and Justice anti-war coalition, co-chairs the UN-based International Coordinating Network on Palestine, and since 2002 has played an active role in the growing global





peace movement. She is co-author of *Ending the US War* in *Afghanistan: A Primer*, among other books, and authors a regular online newsletter.
